All, I am developing a table top exercise for a marine fire fighting scenario that the Coast Guard will be hosting in May. We want to identify shortfalls with our marine firefighting task force so that we can continue to develop our plan. I am finalizing some details with George Mowbray of the Lake Charles pilots to make the scenario realistic. The scenario will involve a collision of a deep draft freight vessel carrying lumber products and a tug pushing two barges of ethyl chloride at four corners on the Calcasieu River. The collision will cause a subsequent fire and the two vessels will wind up closest to Ward 4 District 2 and Ward 3 District 2. I have drafted an ICS structure based on what I think would be involved that I would like to use during the exercise and incorporate into our plan. Please take a look at it and let me know your thoughts.

Due to the complexity of the incident I believe the unified command would consist of the Coast Guard, GOHSEP, and the vessel master for best coordination. The Ops, Planning, and Logistics Chiefs should be from the fire discipline. Finance would either be through the vessel owner or through the Coast Guard overseeing federalized funds. I would recommend CDR Reams, Dick Gremillion, and a participant from the Maritime Industry to act as the unified command. Additionally, I would like to ask that Chief Manuel act as Operations Chief and Chief Savoie act as the Planning Chief. Your participation would make this a very valuable table top exercise. I will be passing the invite on to others as we finalize some more details. I will be the facilitator for the exercise.

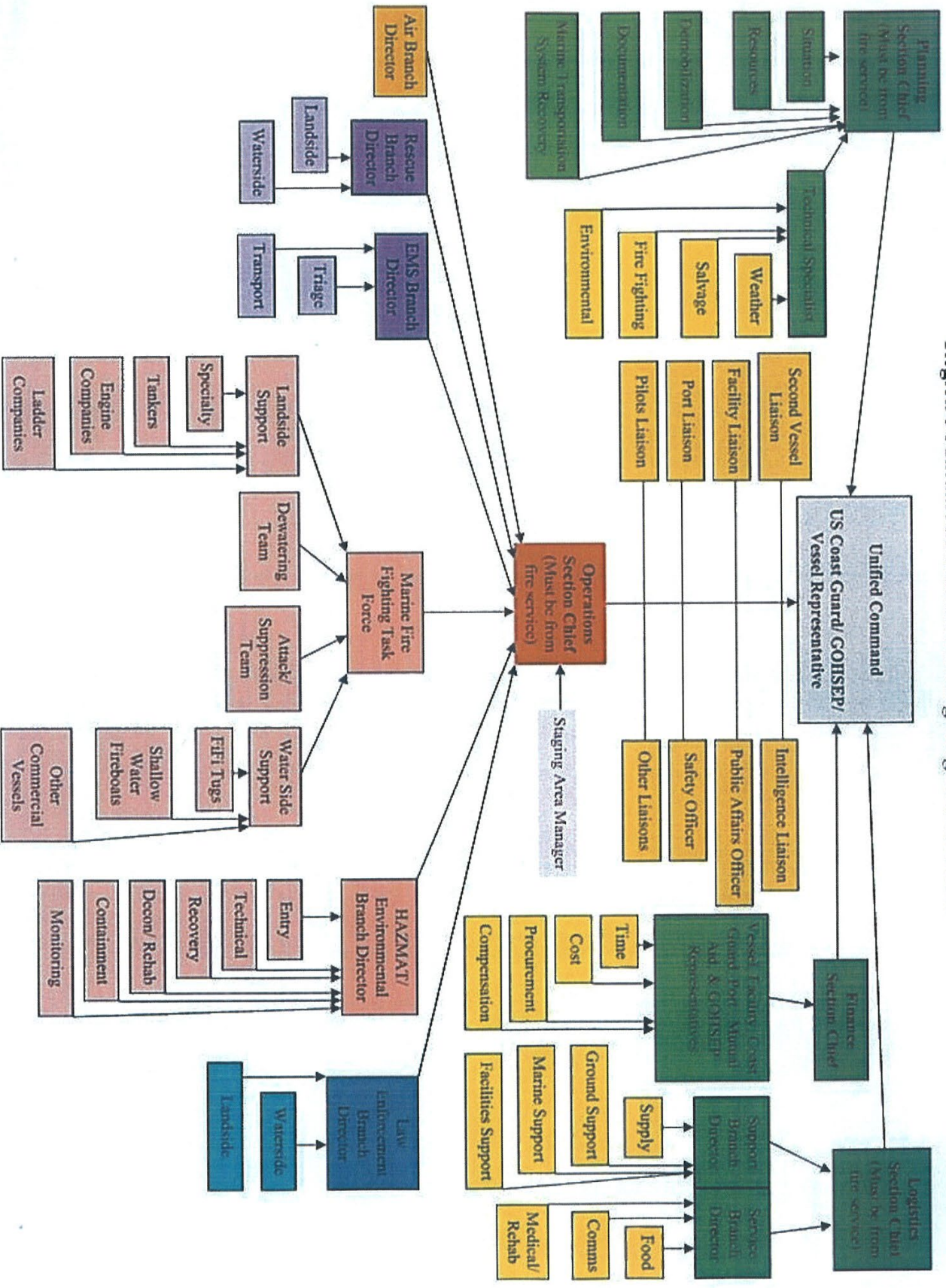
The exercise will shadow the same capabilities we currently have through mutual aid:
