- Greg Satterfield, the November LEPC meeting was a great turn out at the Lyondell/Basell facility. It was great to have the meeting and let everyone know what they have to offer at their facility
- CAER Committee, they are in the process of updating the notification forms and also are talking about pulling the CAER off the City's system and moving it to another site
- And also working on a Hazmat book for good information if emergency responders have to go out to a facility
- John Ieyoub, the City and the Railroad have been meeting and in March the traffic for trains will increase inside the City, and they are working on how to mitigate a plan
- The City has hired a consultant to see where more crossing stuff and horn blowing will be, mostly on Sallier St.
- The railroad will be bringing a total of 150 cars and the city is working on only 45 cars through the city at a time
- 911 could coordinate with the train to know if and what intersections would be blocked at the time
- Next meeting John will have an update from the Mayor

• Incidents:

- ✓ On January 19, 2015, was an incident of a possible bomb threat called in on top of the 2-10 bridge, both sides of the bridge were shutdown and the suspect for arrested. There was no bomb found and later the afternoon both sides of the bridge were open. Also the waterways were also shutdown during the incident
- ✓ Ian Johnson, USCG, received a text message of a bomb threat at a facility in Houston, TX, vinyl chloride
- ✓ Ron Tower, the green dye in the water was from P66 doing a tank dye, P66 did make all the possible notifications
- ✓ Odor at the PPG Dr. exit was not P66 but they did help with finding the source of where the odor was coming from
- ✓ Rob, it's getting harder to pen point where the odors coming from, and with all the pipelines in the area it could be anything
- ✓ Ron Tower, With the clearing of the land going on and digging up of the old swamp lands and the odors coming from there
- ✓ Ron Tower, on September 26 the railroad called 911 for a Sulfur dioxide odor that they were trapped and were upset cause they could not move, if they would have moved the train from where they were it would have been unsafe
- ✓ Ron Tower, On November 23, 2014 P66 had a fire at their facility, it was a gasoline fire
- ✓ Response teams were called out, it was a very congested area and it could have really got out of control, it was put out about 7:30pm, they didn't have to call for an Shelter in Place.
- ✓ They were fined a fee for being 13 minutes late on notifying State police and 6 minutes being late notifying the NRC
- ✓ Mason motioned that we accept this discussion as a review of the Phillips 66 fire on November 23, 2014,
